# Executive Summary

The Australian Meat Processor Corporation (AMPC) launched the *More to Meat* campaign in August 2022 to highlight the important role of red meat processors in the communities they operate in.

As a part of the *More to Meat* campaign, AMPC has published this report to highlight the contribution and jobs supported by the red meat processing industry.

The data reveals that more than one hundred thousand jobs across Australia are underpinned by red meat processors.



The industry works within communities, supporting farmers, local small businesses, and retailers to deliver world-class red meat that feeds families in Australia and is admired from Japan to the United States.

Data is drawn from a report completed by SG Heilbron Pty Ltd in 2022 and was commissioned by AMPC. Additional 2022 data was drawn from the Australia Bureau of Statistics with internal calculations conducted by AMPC.

The purpose of this report is to provide an analysis of the socio-economic impact of the red meat processing industry nationally and by state.

## Metric Definitions

### Total value added:

The value of output at basic prices minus the value of intermediate consumption at purchasers' prices. The term is used to describe gross product by industry.

#### Household income:

Total compensation of employees payable by an enterprise to an employee in return for work.

#### **Employment:**

Total full-time equivalent (FTE) jobs in the industry whereby part-time positions are converted to full-time positions.

#### Percentage of workforce:


The calculations are using AMPC's direct employment figures divided by ABS Manufacturing employment data for each state.



Red meat processing directly employs 1 in 31 Australians who work in the manufacturing sector.




Total contribution to household income:

47,500<sub>(FTE</sub>


The red meat processing industry's contribution to full-time employment in Queensland totalled more than 47,500 jobs.

The Queensland red meat processing industry's total contribution to household income is estimated to be more than \$2.2 billion.

\$6.4b

In total, the Queensland red meat processing industry is estimated to generate more than \$6.4 billion in industry value added.

## Victoria

Total employment:

The red meat processing industry's contribution to full-time employment in Victoria totalled more than 38,800 jobs.

Victorian Manufacturing Workforce:

1 in 47

Red meat processing directly employs 1 in 47 Victorians who work in the manufacturing sector.





Total contribution to household income:

The Victorian red meat processing industry's total contribution to household income is estimated to be more than \$2 billion.

Total value added:

In total, the Victorian red meat processing industry is estimated to be more than \$5.6 billion in industry value added.

# New South Wales

Total employment:

34,000

(FTE)

The red meat processing industry's contribution to full-time employment in New South Wales totaled more than 34,000 jobs.

New South Wales Manufacturing Workforce:

1 in 33

Red meat processing directly employs 1 in 33 New South Wales workers in the manufacturing sector.



Total contribution to household income:

\$1.9b

The New South Wales red meat processing industry's total contribution to household income is estimated to be more than \$1.9 billion.

#### Total value added:

\$5.1b

In total, the New South Wales red meat processing industry is estimated to b more than \$5.1 billion in total industry value added.

Western Australia

1 in 45

Red meat processing directly employs 1 in 45 South Australians who work in the manufacturing sector.





Total contribution to household income:

\$310m

The South Australian red meat processing industry's total contribution to household income is estimated to be more than \$310 million.

#### Total value added:

\$1b

In total, the South Australian red meat processing industry is estimated to generate more than \$1 billion in industry value added.

## Tasmania

Total employment:

3,470<sub>(FTE)</sub>

The Tasmanian red meat processing industry's total contribution to full-time employment in Tasmania totalled 3,470 jobs.

Tasmanian Manufacturing Workforce:

1 in 20

Red meat processing directly employs 1 in 20 Tasmanians who work in the manufacturing sector.





Total contribution to household income:

\$185m

The Tasmanian red meat processing industry's total contribution to household income is estimated to be more than \$185 million.

Total value added:

\$620m

In total, the Tasmanian red meat processing industry is estimated to generate more than \$620 million in industry value added.
